She has made a full recovery, and she is now living with a family who had recently lost their other dog to a long battle with cancer. JACK AND JILL – These two little kittens were found in a parking lot as kittens. They were feral, but quickly became very sweet and social and were adopted by a loving family.

PAUSE FOR PAWS



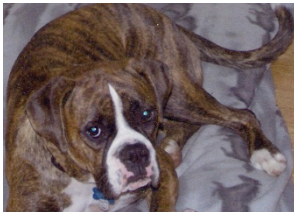

BUSTER BROWN – He was hit by a car and surrendered to our hospital by his owner after being examined, and it was determined that he had a broken hind leg and would need a very complicated surgery. One of our staff members fell in love with him and agreed to pay for his surgery, and he lives with her family and wouldn't trade him for anything.



CHANCE – He was surrendered to Riverside by his owners because he did not enjoy living with the other pets in the household. He lived with us for two years, until he was adopted by an elderly woman, who provided the perfect home for him.



HENRY – One of our doctors rescued Henry from the shelter after he was seized from his owner for abuse and neglect. He is blind, but he has the best personality and is such a fun, loving big boy. One of our very kind clients fell in love with him and agreed to financially support his treatment and then found a special place for him to go in Virginia to be worked with. They quickly found him a home with a wonderful family who loves him dearly.
